Statement – for immediate release Regional Victoria: It's time to really Open

4 June 2021

In February 2021, following Lockdown 3.0 the Victorian Regional Chamber Alliance together with like groups released a letter to the State Government asking for a detailed plan of how the State would manage any further lockdowns.

In February, we suggested a more nuanced approach when shutting down areas and regions. A 'one-size-fits-all' approach may have been necessary in the early days of this virus, but a total shutdown of the economy cannot be the only answer if we are to live with some levels of the virus in the community into the future. It must be acknowledged that other states have managed to identify and localise shutdowns and restrictions.

Here we are in again in June with another shut down and continuing restrictions as we look towards the long weekend and school holidays.

Once again, we welcome the state Government's decision to slightly ease restrictions in regional Victoria, but to imply regional Victoria is open, dismisses the reality for so many regional businesses.

Most sectors continue to be impacted either by remaining locked down or are so constrained by density limits, they cannot afford to open, or if open will incur financial losses.

"In the absence of Melbourne visitors, we ask the government to support regional Victorian's capacity to support regional Victorian businesses. Regional businesses who rely on the Melbourne market are effectively still in a "soft lockdown" because their customers in a hard lockdown."

"Lockdowns for one week can equal anywhere between 3 and 8 weeks adverse impact on a businesses revenue. It affects consumer confidence when they think about re-booking. The State Govt, when imposing a lockdown, must support businesses that are doing the right thing. Through no fault of their own, they are at risk of going to the wall"
